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To the citizens of Erie County:

Respectfully submitted for your review is the annual report for your Erie County Sheriff's Office for calendar year 2012. This report covers in detail the activity generated as we carried out our varied statutory and public service duties and responsibilities throughout the year.

Your Sheriff's Office consists of three divisions: the Patrol Division, comprised of Patrol Deputy Sheriffs, Detectives, and Dispatchers; the Jail Division; and the Civil Division.

A brief review of the information contained in the report reveals the following interesting statistics for each division of the Sheriff's office for 2012:

- We received 16,173 classified calls for service, an increase of 12% from the previous year. While that number increased, we are pleased to report that major index crimes (homicides, rapes, robberies, felonious assaults, burglaries, and breaking and entering) decreased 31% from the previous year.
- Law enforcement efforts resulted in sworn personnel serving 867 arrest warrants and making 1,864 criminal arrests. Our traffic enforcement efforts resulted in 118 impaired driving arrests, the issuance of 2,179 traffic citations, and the issuance of 2,408 traffic warnings. We also investigated 716 traffic crashes. Our detectives opened 115 investigative case files and closed 279 investigations during the year.
- Dispatchers received a total of 30,164 calls through the 9-1-1 system.
- Civil process efforts resulted in the service of 5,113 writs (subpoenas, protection orders, and other forms of civil process directed to the Sheriff for service) and the sale of 409 parcels as a result of court-ordered Sheriff's Sales. The Civil Division also coordinates sex offender registrations and concealed handgun license issuance. We registered 327 sex offenders during 2012, and issued 1,421 concealed handgun licenses. Since 2002, the number of sex offenders registered by the Sheriff's Office has increased over 55%, and the number of concealed handgun licenses issued in 2012 was an increase of 115% from 2011.
- Corrections officers booked a total of 3,682 arrestees into the Erie County Jail. The average daily population of the jail was 123 inmates.

Other information of interest for 2012 for your Sheriff's Office includes the following:

- Sheriff Terry Lyons, with over 25 years of service with the agency, including almost 12 years as the Sheriff, retired on May 31, 2012. Sheriff Paul Sigsworth was appointed to replace Sheriff Lyons by the Erie County Commission and the Erie County Democratic Central Committee, and was then subsequently elected to a full term in office in the November general election.
- Lieutenant Robert J. Werner, who served with the Sheriff's Office as a Patrol Division deputy, Detective Sergeant, and Patrol Division Lieutenant for over 35 years, retired in June.
- We continued to maintain Patrol Division substations in Margaretta, Groton, Oxford, Huron, Milan, Berlin, Vermilion, and Florence Townships. The existence of these substations allows for our Patrol Division deputies to report directly to assigned areas of the county at shift change, greatly reducing response times to calls for service and increasing visibility throughout the rural areas of the county. These substations would not be possible without the cooperative relationship that we enjoy with the township trustees in all townships throughout the county.
- With the cooperation of educators in the Edison and Margaretta Local Schools districts, we continued to provide a Patrol Division Deputy Sheriff to instruct the DARE program to students in both districts.
- With the cooperation of educators at EHOVE, we continued to provide a Patrol Division Deputy Sheriff under contract as a school resource deputy at the school. This was the eleventh consecutive year for that program.
- With the cooperation of educators at Firelands College of Bowling Green State University, we continued to provide two Patrol Division Deputy Sheriffs under contract to provide primary law enforcement services at the university campus. This cooperative program has been in place for many years.
- With the cooperation of educators at the North Point Educational Services Center, we continued to provide a Patrol Division Deputy Sheriff under contract as a school resource deputy at their facility.
- With the cooperation of Erie County Engineer Jack Farschman, we continued to detail one Patrol Division Deputy Sheriff to primarily perform commercial motor vehicle weight enforcement duties throughout Erie County.


- With the cooperation of the Huron Township Trustees, we continued to provide two Patrol Division Deputy Sheriffs under contract to provide additional law enforcement service to the residents of Huron Township.
- With the joint cooperation of both the Huron Township Trustees and educators at Firelands College of Bowling Green State University, we provided, under a new contract, one Patrol Division Deputy Sheriff to provide additional law enforcement services, whose duties are split between the township and the university.
- Through the Northern Border Initiative, we continued to receive grant funds from Ohio Homeland Security allowing for marine patrols to be conducted in Lake Erie along the Erie County/Canadian border. A total of 36 marine patrols, totaling more than 383 hours, were conducted with our grant funded 32- foot Boston Whaler marine patrol boat. Staffing assistance for the marine patrol was received from both the Sandusky and Huron Police Departments.
- We continued to contract for, or otherwise provide, emergency public safety dispatching service with political subdivisions throughout Erie County. Along with dispatching Sheriff's Office personnel, we dispatched the Sandusky Police and Fire Departments, Huron Police and Fire Departments, Bay View Police and Fire Departments, Kelleys Island Police, Fire, and EMS Departments, Erie Metroparks, and the Margaretta Township, Groton Township, and Vermilion Township Fire Departments. Through the Sheriff's Office Dispatch Advisory Board, chaired by Sandusky Fire Department Chief Paul Ricci and comprised of the chiefs of the agencies that we dispatch for, we continued to work toward additional consolidation of dispatch services for public safety agencies throughout the county.
- We continued to host the co-location of dispatchers for the Perkins Township Police Department.
- We continued to host the operations of the Perkins Township Police Department as that agency's new facility was under construction.
- We continued to cooperate with all law enforcement agencies throughout Erie County by providing back up assistance as requested. We also continued to host monthly countywide police chiefs meetings allowing for direct communication and information sharing between all of the county's police chiefs and other attendees from representing law enforcement agencies from local, state, and federal agencies.

- We continued to work cooperatively with the Erie County Commission and all other county elected officials in an effort to provide the most cost-efficient law enforcement services to our constituents throughout the county.
- 2012 was a year of unprecedented violence in Erie County, with numerous homicides occurring in the City of Sandusky. At the request of the Sandusky Police Department, Sheriff's Office personnel provided numerous hours of assistance to that agency as needed.



# PATROL DIVISION OVERVIEW

Chief Deputy Jared L. Oliver supervises the Patrol Division of your Sheriff's Office. He has a number of years experience with the agency, having served as a Corrections Officer, Patrol Division Deputy, and Detective, Detective Sergeant, and Detective Lieutenant. He graduated from the 242<sup>nd</sup> Session of the FBI National Academy in 2011, and was promoted to Chief Deputy Sheriff on June 1, 2012.

Chief Deputy Oliver is the second-in-command of your Sheriff's Office. In the event that Sheriff Sigsworth is absent or unavailable, Chief Deputy Oliver commands the entire agency.

The Patrol Division is composed of Patrol Deputy Sheriffs, Detectives, and Dispatchers.


During 2012, Patrol Deputy Sheriffs totaled twenty five in number, exclusive of contract positions and three deputies assigned to the Detective Bureau.

Also during 2012, your Sheriff's Office provided four Patrol Deputy Sheriffs at the Erie County Courthouse to provide security for Common Pleas Court personnel in the courtrooms and throughout the building. Those deputies also conducted prisoner transports between the Courthouse and the county jail, and between other facilities throughout the state and the county jail, and provided security and supervision for those transported prisoners.

## WARRANTS SERVED BY YEAR



## ARRESTS BY MONTH 2012





# JAIL DIVISION OVERVIEW

Captain Todd Dempsey is the Erie County Jail Administrator, and Lieutenant Robert Robles is the Assistant Erie County Jail Administrator. Together, they oversaw the operation of the Erie County Jail in 2012. They were responsible for the operation of the only jail facility in Erie County. In addition to the two administrators, the jail is staffed by twenty five full-time, and a number of part-time, Corrections Officers.

Prisoner meals are provided under contract by the Aramark Corporation, and that company operates the jail's in-house kitchen. Based upon an average daily jail census of 123 prisoners during 2012, a total of 134,685 meals were served. The average cost of each meal is \$1.25.


Jail nursing services are provided every day by contract with the Erie County Health Department, and jail physician services are provided by contract with Northern Ohio Medical Specialists (NOMS).

The operation of the Erie County Jail received satisfactory reviews by the members of the Erie County Grand Jury, who routinely inspect the jail as part of their statutory duty.





## AVERAGE DAILY POPULATION



# **CIVIL DIVISION OVERVIEW**

Administrative Captain Steve Westcott supervises the Civil Division of your Sheriff's Office. He is a former Perkins Township Police Department patrol officer and sergeant, a former Erie County Common Pleas Court adult probation officer, a former employee of the Erie County Auditor's Office, and began his employment with the Sheriff's Office as the Assistant Jail Administrator.


The Civil Division is responsible for all civil, fiscal, payroll, personnel, records, sex offender registration, concealed handgun license, background check, and grant reporting duties of your Sheriff's Office. During 2012, Captain Westcott supervised three full-time secretaries, one part-time secretary, and one clerk.

## LICENSE ISSUANCE BY YEAR

In April of 2004 Ohio's Concealed Carry Law became effective. In the nine months of 2004 that Ohioans could carry concealed handguns, the Erie County Sheriff's office issued 508 licenses. The graph below illustrates the number of licenses issued since the 2004 Concealed Carry Law became effective.

# FISCAL/CIVIL DIVISION STATISTICS

## SEX OFFENDERS

The Ohio Legislature enacted Ohio Revised Code Chapter 2950, the Sex Offender Registration law, in 1997 know as Megan's Law. This law requires persons convicted of specified crimes and has designated them as a Sexual Predator, Habitual Sex Offender or Sexually Oriented Offender, to register with the Sheriff of the county in which they will reside. This registration procedure takes place upon release from a term of imprisonment or, if not imprisoned, then upon moving into a county after conviction.

Starting in January 1, 2008 the Adam Walsh Act was implemented in Ohio. It changed the structure of how the offenders were classified. The Tier System was implemented with Tier I Offenders being the least serious class and Tier III Offenders being the most serious class. Community notifications are performed on Tier III Offenders that had notifications performed under the old law.

In June of 2010 the Ohio Supreme Court ruled in State v Bodyke that the Ohio Attorney General had no authority to reclassify Sex Offenders who had already had a Judicial Hearing under Megan's Law. As such, all Megan's Law classified Sex Offenders were changed back to their original classification.

In 2012 a total of 12 Sexually Oriented Offenders were removed from the registry after their registration requirements expired. Also in 2012 a total of \$225.00 in registration fees were collected, 327 registrations were performed, 264 follow up investigations were performed with 12 arrests being made.


