Plenary Presenter:

Crime Victims' Rights in Ohio Post Marsy's Law

OCVJC Victims' Rights Training is a three-hour comprehensive, multi-disciplinary training that informs trainees about the legal rights of victims and the ethical obligations of the attorneys assisting them. The training includes a focus on access to justice for crime victims. Many of these rights have changed with the passage of 2017's Issue 1, Marsy's Law. This training will update criminal justice officials and related professionals on these changes to victims' constitutional and statutory rights.

In particular, the training covers the following topics and phases:

- (1) The rights of crime victims at the Hospital and Investigation Phases
 - Certain types of victims have rights when they visit hospitals, these include sexual assault victims, domestic violence victims, victims who are immigrants, and victims who are deaf or hard of hearing or have a limited English language proficiency
 - There are over 72 rights, requirements, requests, best practices, or pieces of supplemental information for crime victims at the hospital and investigative phases
 - Most of these rights are automatic and must be provided to the victims without request
- (2) The rights of crime victims during Prosecution
 - There are over 84 rights, requirements, requests, best practices, or pieces of supplemental information for crime victims at the prosecution phase
 - Some of rights are automatic and some must be requested
- (3) The rights of crime victims once an offender has been convicted
 - There are over 47 rights, requirements, requests, best practices, or pieces of supplemental information at this phase
- (4) Special topics in victims' rights law as pertinent to each trainee group
 - Certain victims have special rights, these include:
 - Domestic violence victims
 - Sexual assault victims
 - Child victims
 - Elderly victims
 - Victims who are deaf or hard of hearing
 - Victims who are limited English proficient
 - Victims with disAbilities
- (5) Use of the Crime Victims' Rights Toolkit
 - The Crime Victims' Rights Toolkit (the Toolkit) is a first of its kind self-help tool for crime victims and those assisting crime victims. The toolkit is designed to educate and inform victims of their rights and to provide victims with mechanisms to enforce those rights
- (6) How/when OCVJC provides pro bono legal assistance to crime victims
- (7) How OCVJC can be a valuable resource crime victims, advocates, justice officials, and other victim service providers
- (8) Technical assistance provided by OCVJC to advocates, justice officials, and other victim service providers
- (9) Other special topics in victims' rights as requested by trainee organizations or groups

Elizabeth Well, Legal Director at Ohio Crime Victim Justice Center Overview On November 7, 2017, Ohio voters passed the Ohio Crime Victims Bill of Rights (or Marsy's Law) with 83% support. The Crime Victims' Bill of Rights is a constitutional amendment that alters the legal landscape in criminal prosecutions in favor of protecting victims and upholding their rights. This training will focus on the changes the Crime Victims' Bill of Rights creates for crime victims, particularly expanded rights to be heard, the right to mandatory restitution, and the right to counsel. Any implementing legislation pending will also be covered.

Break Out Sessions:

Session 1: **Street Drugs and the Effects on the User**
Dr. Patrick Tupa, Firelands Regional Medical Center- Emergency Services

In this session, we will discuss the various types of drugs that are commonly used in this area and the impact that those drugs have on the human body and mind. We will explore the growing drug problem and the connections between drugs, domestic violence, sexual assaults, and human trafficking.

Session 2: **Domestic Violence Investigation**
Pam Hayman-Weaner, LAW0 & Defiance County Sheriff Doug Engel

In this workshop we will apply the domestic violence statute and the preferred arrest statutes to a video based interactive domestic violence investigation with an emphasis on determining the primary physical aggressor.

Session 3: **Science of Addiction and Recovery**
Joey & Mary Supina, Sandusky Artisans Recovery Community Center-an Ohio Certified Peer Recovery Organization(PRO)

In this section, we will discuss the various types of drugs that are commonly used in this area and the impact that those drugs have on the human body and mind. We will explore the growing drug problem and will focus on creating an understanding of recovery. While the growing drug problem in the area is leaving many to feel overwhelmed and helpless, we know that there are agencies that are able to help. We will explore the idea of recovery and identify the services available in the area for people to get help. We will also discuss the movement in Ohio to start utilizing peer supporters in an effort to help people overcome addiction.

Session 4: **Stalking Investigation**
Pam Hayman-Weaner, LAW0 & Defiance County Sheriff Doug Engel

In this session, we will apply the menacing by stalking statute to an interactive stalking investigation and examine its overlap with domestic violence and protection order violations.

Day 2 Plenary Session: **Basics of Mental Health Intervention and Trauma Informed Care**
Karen Russell PCC-S, LCDC III & Bruce Kijowski, LISW-S, Firelands Counseling and Recovery Services

This session will provide information on behavioral health concerns and how to identify crisis situations. Will review response and intervention to a crisis. Focus on the role of trauma and how this can impact the person and situation immediately and in the days and weeks to come.

Session 5: **Does Viewing Pornography Increase Domestic Violence Toward Women?**

Tim Wise, MA, LPCCs Firelands Counseling & Recovery Services

This presentation will explore the history of pornography and whether there is a connection between viewing pornography and domestic violence toward women.

Session 6: **Legal Updates: NEW Dating Violence CPOs and Other Changes Regarding DV, SA, and Stalking**

Carl Anderson, Legal Aid of Western Ohio

This session will discuss the new Dating Violence Civil Protection Order and legal updates regarding Domestic Violence, Sexual Assault, and Stalking. We will focus on major legal and legislative developments in the law, including recently enacted and pending legislation. Significant cases impacting Ohio's domestic violence and human trafficking laws and practices will also be discussed.

Session 7: **The Assessment and Identification of Victims of Human Trafficking**

Lara Wilken, MSN, RN Firelands Regional Medical Center

The objectives for this session are:

- What is human trafficking?
- How do you identify victims?
- Mental health and medical issues associated with human trafficking.
- Initial Communication and barriers.
- What is the role of the healthcare provider during treatment.

Session 8: **Report Writing for First Responders**

Laura Alkire, City of Huron Law Director

This session will address the importance of proper documentation for first responders to a domestic violence incident. It will also highlight how to document important observations and interviews in a written report. The focus will be for law enforcement, EMS/EMT, and nurses.

Closing Session: **Protecting Yourself and Clients from Financial Abuse and Scams**

Melissa Grahn, United States Secret Service

This session will discuss current frauds that are being committed, involving ATM skimmers & shimmers, credit card scams, scams aimed at the elderly and then go over some of the things that you can do to help to try and prevent being a victim of these frauds. You will be able to assist your clients to help protect themselves from financial abuse and scams.
