Erie County's Fair Housing Mission Statement

Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968, as amended, prohibits discrimination in housing and declares it a national policy to provide, within constitutional limits, fair housing opportunities within the United States. Erie County urges that all citizens of the Firelands area become aware of and support the Fair Housing Act.





Fair Housing Act



Federal Protection

Officially known as Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968, as amended, it is now referred to as the Fair Housing Act



Discrimination Prohibited

The Fair Housing Act prohibits discrimination in housing on the basis of:

- Race or color
- National origin
- Religion
 - Sex
- Familial status



- Disability
- Military Status (March 24, 2008)



What Is Prohibited?

In the Sale and Rental of Housing

No one may take any of the following actions based on race, color, national origin, religion, sex, familial status, handicap or military status:

Refuse to negotiate, rent or sell housing

Make housing unavailable



Set different terms, conditions or privileges for sale or rental of a dwelling

Provide different housing services or facilities

Falsely deny that housing is available for inspection, sale, or rental

For profit, persuade owners to sell or rent (blockbusting) or

Deny anyone access to or membership in a facility or service (such as a multiple listing service) related to the sale or rental of housing.





What Is Prohibited?

In Mortgage Lending

No one may take any of the following actions based on race, color, national origin, religion, sex, familial status handicap or military status:

Refuse to make a mortgage loan

Refuse to provide information regarding loans

Impose different terms or conditions on a loan, such as different interest rates, points, or fees

Discriminate in appraising property

Refuse to purchase a loan or

Set different terms or conditions for purchasing a loan.

What Is Prohibited?



In Addition It is illegal for anyone to:


- Threaten, coerce, intimidate or interfere with anyone exercising a fair housing right or assisting others who exercise that right
- Advertise or make any statement that indicates a limitation or preference based on race, color, national origin, religion, sex, familial status, handicap or military status:
- Discriminatory advertising applies to single-family and owneroccupied housing that is otherwise exempt from the Fair Housing Act.

If You Think Your Rights Have Been Violated


Erie County is ready to help with any problem related to housing discrimination. If you think your rights have been violated, you may fill out a Housing Discrimination Complaint Form, write Erie County a letter, or telephone the Erie County Fair Housing Hotline. You have one year after an alleged violation to file a complaint, but you should file it as soon as possible.





What to Tell Us:

- Your name and address
- The name and address of the person your complaint is against (the respondent)
- The address or other identification of the housing involved
- A short description of the alleged violation (the event that caused you to believe your rights were violated)
- The date(s) of the alleged violation


