ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- Resident of Erie County
- Charge pending in Erie County Juvenile Court
- You must be determined either drug dependent or in danger of becoming drug dependent by your treatment provider
- You must be able to actively participate in treatment

DISQUALIFYING CRITERIA

- There are some serious charges that may result in disqualification

JUVENILE SUCCESS DIVISION

WHO

Juvenile Success Division (JSD) is designed to provide assistance to youth who are struggling with drug and alcohol abuse and continue to have involvement with law enforcement and the courts.

JSD also assists parents in providing a safe sober environment for their children to achieve success.



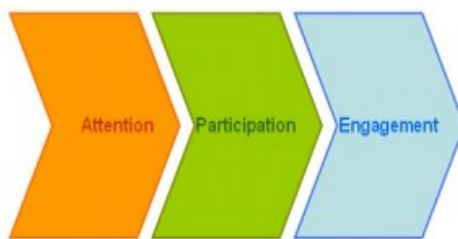
HOW

Juvenile Success Division uses the team approach to provide a path to success for each JSD Program Participant. The program is divided into 4 phases and each phase has specific goals and expectations. The program lasts a minimum of 24 weeks.

WHAT

We know that each child is different and what works for one, won't work for all. JSD develops an individualized plan to meet the needs of each youth. That plan includes -

- Regular judicial supervision
- Individualized Drug and Alcohol Treatment
- Intensive community supervision
- Random/observed drug and alcohol testing
- Participation in pro-social activity
- School attendance and engagement
- Parental support programs (if needed)



GRADUATION!

Once all program and treatment goals are reached two things will happen:

- Graduation from Juvenile Success Division
- Termination from Probation
