This application must be accompanied by a certificate from a judge described in Ohio Revised Code Section 147.02. Page two of this form may be completed to meet this requirement. To obtain the judge's signature you may need to complete additional requirements such as a class, test or background check as required by the county in which you reside. Please contact your local bar association or county for additional information. Reminder: Ohio Revised Code section 147.05 provides that, before entering upon the duties of the office, a notary public shall present his/her commission to be recorded (with the oath endorsed therein) with the clerk of court of common pleas of the county in which the notary resides.

To Be Completed by All Applicants (New or Renewal)

This certificate must be made by a justice of the Ohio Supreme Court, judge of an Ohio court of appeals, or judge of an Ohio court of common pleas. (Currently, justices of the supreme court decline to sign such certificates.)
