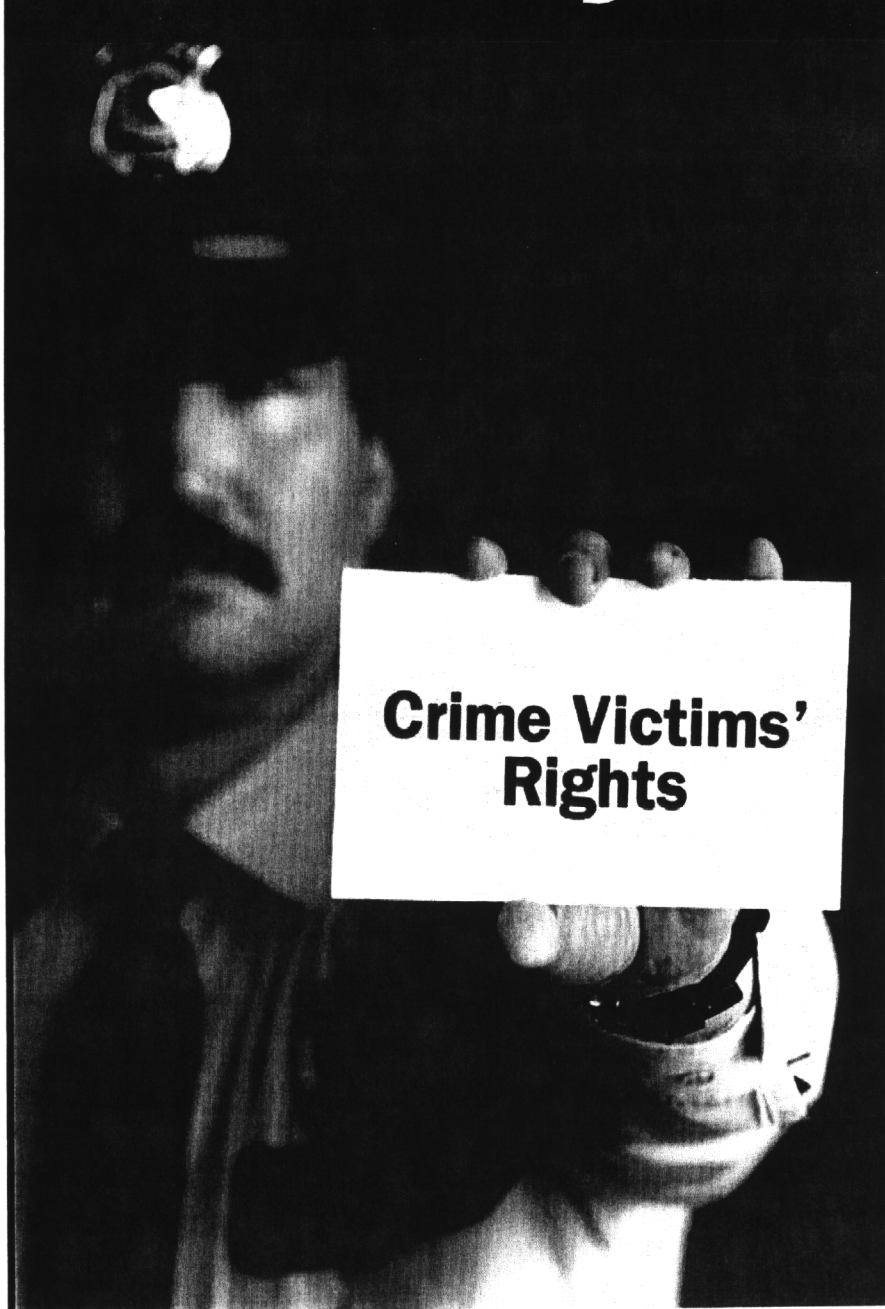


# You have the right... too.
